

### **Blended Intensive Programme**

A blended intensive programme (BIP) is a short mobility involving at least 3 higher education institutions from 3 different <u>pro-</u> <u>gramme countries</u> that includes a physical and a virtual component. The workload should be equivalent to at least 3 ECTS. Participants in the physical mobility (i.e. travelling participants) should receive funding through the Erasmus mobility programme of their home institution (SMS, SMP, STA or STT).
